Building on Newman's Vision

The Newman Meeting Place

Our church of St Mary and St Nicholas, Littlemore, Oxford, was built in 1836 by John Henry Newman, key member of the Oxford Movement, theologian and poet.



182 years later, St. Mary and St. Nicholas is a vital centre for worship, music and community. But in our current state we lack some of the basics. We are now in the process of implementing our mission statement, 'To renew Newman's vision for the 21st century; and to transform a simple church into a spiritual, cultural and social meeting place, in order to serve the needs of the diverse community of Littlemore.'

What are the issues in Littlemore?

Littlemore is ranked in the bottom 10% Parishes in the National Index of Multiple Deprivation (NIMD)

It has pockets with high levels of poverty and unemployment, along with low skills and low educational achievement.

- 30% of children in Littlemore are living in poverty.
- 36% of households with children are headed by a lone parent.
- 26% of working adults have no qualifications.
- Some 40% of the population aged over 60 are considered to be income deprived and one of the four wards of Littlemore has the highest loneliness indicator for the over 65s.

We are determined to make our church a meeting place for the community where all can flourish.



Together, we can make a difference.

The design

You won't be able to see any changes from the outside, as we are going to preserve its historic beauty. The changes will all be on the inside.

In the Newman Meeting Place:


- at church entrance kitchen, toilet, balcony for organ and musicians
- new heating, lighting and AV system
- redecoration, flexible seating
- Heritage/educational facility

Vestry area:

merge the two small rooms into one large meeting space and install toilet

Sanctuary:

renovate the reredos and renew kneelers



What will the project deliver?

We already have our regular services, including many baptisms, weddings and funerals. We host family activities, including a St Nicholas Festival, an annual community Harvest of Talents art exhibition and a number of concerts. However, we are also planning:

- Coffee Shop sessions three mornings a week
- monthly over 60s tea and cake with live music and dancing
- weekly parent and toddler sessions
- regular drop-in befriending sessions
- an information stand for Newman pilgrims
- Godly Play sessions for the John Henry Newman Academy (primary school)
- yearly lecture series on Newman
- new seasonal family activities
- education material for all ages about the history of the church
